## 22-Mile Speed Enough to Win Sports Car Race

Twenty-two miles per hour iced victory Sunday in the Nebraska Region of the Sports Car Club of America's latest racing event at Lake Wakonda, in the Missouri River bottom area at the eastern edge of Cass County.

Slow, you say? Not really! Because Dale Flesher literally iced the victory on—not around—the lake.

The event was an Ice Gymkhana, in which drivers raced around a 1.1-mile course marked by pylons on the lake. Studded tires were allowed, but they cost you penalty points.

Mr. Flesher, driving a Porsche, had a combined time of 5 minutes 57 seconds for two runs around the course, 12 seconds better than Jerry Sievers in a TR-4. Gordon Smiley, in a Cobra, was third with a time of 6 minutes 12 seconds.
